

## **Adult Formation Offerings for Lent**

On the Sundays in Lent, we are offering two Sunday morning spiritual formation classes for adults. After gathering in your "homeroom," choose from one of these learning opportunities:

Finding Jesus in the Psalms: A Lenten Journey (facilitated by Burt Waller, room 113) In this study we engage in meaningful encounters with the Psalms through a series of readings to guide us in the season of Lent. Combining an interpretation of the psalms with real life stories, the study moves through the familiar words of Psalm 23 toward the painful cries of Psalm 22 uttered by Jesus on the cross. The study includes reflections on the life of King David and the original context of the writings, along with connections between the psalms and the life and death of Jesus the Messiah.

In this study we explore difficult sayings of Jesus that relate to discipleship. We make our way to the cross and reflect on our willingness to follow Jesus no matter where the relationship with him might take us. In week one, Jesus looks toward Jerusalem and expects his disciples to do the same. Week two considers discipleship through the lens of God's inclusive call to God's feast. In the third week, we are challenged to question any allegiance that might hinder our discipleship. During the fourth week, the class highlights the celebration when the "lost" are no longer lost. Week five provides a significant teaching moment when a rich ruler is called to give up everything to follow Jesus. Throughout the month, we ask, "Will we have the courage to give up everything for Christ too?"

## **Setting the Lenten Table**

As we continue our journey through this 40-day season of spiritual reflection and anticipation of Easter, our sanctuary has some added elements to enhance our times of worship. Each object is there as an invitation to remembrance and each Sunday has a different focal point for our attention. The object symbolizing each week's emphasis is placed at the front of the table.

The bread on the first Sunday in Lent was there to remind us that Jesus resists the temptation to turn stones to bread. We remember that we are sustained by the word of God.



In the second week, the lantern recalls the story of Nicodemus coming to Jesus by night. Jesus brings to light that all the truth we think we know is not all the truth there is. We remember that in the light of Christ, nothing is hidden.

In the third week, the rocks on the table invite us to remember the children of Israel complaining against God and Moses in the wilderness. Like them, we sometimes wonder whether God is for us. We remember that God's proof comes in the form of mercy. Water flows from a rock and evidence of God's good mercy is on full display.

In the fourth week, the basin and pitcher help take us to a story from the Fourth Gospel. Jesus encounters a Samaritan woman at a well alone and in the middle of the day. Jesus provides the gift of living water to everyone who asks of him. We remember his assurance that all of us can begin again.

In the fifth week, we hear the cry of the psalmist who calls out to God from the depths of despair. We have rope on the table to remember that we are bound all too tightly to that which keeps us from the fullness of life God desires for us. Therefore, God comes to be with us in the depths. We remember that when we are too weak to hang on to God, God is hanging on to us.

In the sixth week – Palm Sunday – we will join the leafy procession of those who hail Jesus as the coming Messiah. The palms on the table help us to recall that Jesus comes in peace to a violent world. We remember that his ways are not our ways.

Hopefully, these enhancements and the images and explanations we are including each week in the orders of worship will add a new dimension to our worship through these days. This is a time of deep meaning, deep reflection, and rich remembrance.

The method of play (like ultimate frisbee) allows everyone to be involved and participate, a metaphor for the Body of Christ. Our focus on fun over victory and encouraging not only those on your team but also those on the competition provides a model for living by the "fruit of the spirit." Now, our youth may not see all those realities while we're playing the game, but we believe it is the reinforcing of these values over time that can lead to deeper faith and our youth embracing these ideals as adults.
