Second Celebrates Holy Week

The season of Lent leads us to a very special seven days in the life of the Church when Holy Week arrives. We have a number of special events on the horizon that help us celebrate this sacred season.

Sunday, April 2: Palm Sunday

Children of all ages will participate in the procession of the palms as we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. As we move through worship, we turn our attention to the gathering shadows as Jesus moves toward his death.

Following worship everyone from every generation is invited to join in our annual intergenerational fish fry in the fellowship hall. This will be a time to celebrate the gift of community and value what comes from being one in the body of Christ.

Thursday, April 6: Maundy Thursday Worship

At 7:00 we come together in the sanctuary where the choir and string quartet will lead in sharing *Light Shines in the Darkness*. As we celebrate the Lord's Supper, we remember the mandate Jesus gave his disciples: that every time we eat the bread and drink the cup we remember his sacrificial death.

Friday, April 7: Good Friday Reflections and Prayers

At noon we come together in the sanctuary for a contemplative service of scripture readings, prayers, and music that summon us to the events of that fateful day. We remember the agony of the cross and depart into the silence that death delivers.

Sunday, April 9: Celebration of the Resurrection

On Easter morning we celebrate the resurrection through music, readings, and prayers. Join us as we recall the joy and hope we find at the discovery of the empty tomb that glorious day!

Join in the richness of what these sacred days have to offer as we share life together and gather for worship on each of these occasions!

Home and Journey: A Model for Spiritual Formation

During worship on the last Sunday in March we heard about a model for adult spiritual formation that we are beginning on April 16, the first Sunday after Easter.

A year ago, our congregation's Sunday school leaders began praying and dreaming together about ways to enhance our spiritual formation offerings on Sunday mornings. Guided by our commitment to the shared values of our "THIS is 2BC" initiatives (Telling our story, Hospitality, Intergenerational ministry, and Spiritual formation), this group crafted a six-month experiment that we set into motion last fall.

Since September we have learned a tremendous amount and I am deeply grateful for everyone who has participated with us in this time of trying new things. We have heard how much people appreciate sharing fellowship and learning alongside people outside of their age groups. We have also heard how deeply valuable people's "home groups" are for sharing care and prayer with one another. We have explored a wide variety of topics, have experienced new and different approaches to prayer, and also reaffirmed our commitment to Bible study and focused, thematic learning.

With all of that in mind, our Sunday school leaders have been working alongside our ministry staff the last several months to develop a plan that will take what we have learned these last six months and guide us into the coming years. What we shared in worship the last Sunday in March provided an overview of this approach.

Using the language of "home" and "journey," we will dedicate certain seasons of life in each year to fostering relationships and spiritual growth. During our "home" times, adults will meet in our traditional age-based groups from 9:00-10:15 on Sunday mornings. The times for fellowship, announcements, prayer, and teaching will all be held with the same group.

During our "journey" times, adults will continue to meet for fellowship, announcements, and prayer from 9:00-9:25. Then, at 9:30, people will break into different intergenerational groups for learning around specific topics and themes.

From April 16 through September 3, we will be in our "home" groups. September 10 through October 1, we will "journey" through a variety of topics that will be offered. We will return "home" October 8 through November 26, then take our Advent "journey" together.

There will be much more publicity and information about all of this as we live into this approach. For now, though, please join me in expressing your gratitude to the teachers who guide our Sunday morning spiritual formation experiences so faithfully week in and week out.



IRA Distributions to Charity - Tax Free!

For those of you living in retirement and drawing on your IRAs, did you know you can actually reduce your income taxes on your Required Minimum Distributions?

Per the IRS.gov website:

"Required minimum distributions (RMDs) are the minimum amounts you must



On November 17, 2022 the Internal Revenue Service reminded IRA owners age 70½ or over of their option to transfer up to \$100,000 to charity tax-free each year.

DISTRIBUTIONS (QCDs) from your IRA

These transfers, known as qualified charitable distributions or QCDs, offer eligible older Americans a great way to easily give to charity each year. Moreover, for those who are at least 72, QCDs count toward the IRA owner's required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year.

Normally, distributions from a traditional individual retirement arrangement (IRA) are taxable when received. With a QCD, however, these distributions become tax-free as long as they're paid directly from the IRA to an eligible charitable organization. QCDs can be made electronically, directly to the charity, or by check payable to the charity.


An IRA distribution, such as an electronic payment made directly to the IRA owner, does not count as a QCD. Likewise, a check made payable to the IRA owner is not a QCD.

Each year, an IRA owner age 70½ or over can exclude from gross income up to \$100,000 of these QCDs. For a married couple, if both spouses are age 70½ or over and both have IRAs, each spouse can exclude up to \$100,000 for a total of up to \$200,000 per year. The QCD option is available regardless of whether an eligible IRA owner itemizes deductions on Schedule A. Transferred amounts are not taxable, and no deduction is available for the transfer."

So, if you'd like to contribute to Second Baptist Church directly from your IRA, simply contact your IRA trustee with instructions. And thank you for your faithfulness!


Passport Youth Camp
