Bringing Where We Have Been

The late poet William Stafford penned a magnificent poem late in the last century called "The Gift." The final stanza begins with these lines:

It's a balance, the taking and passing along, the composting of where you've been and how people and weather treated you. It's a country where you already are, bringing where you have been.

The balance of "taking and passing along" is much on my mind these days. As our congregation moves deeper into conversations about how we connect with our community, imagining and reimagining what it means to *be* the Church and *do* the work of the Church in our world now, this idea of "taking and passing along" as Stafford names it, certainly comes to mind.

For more than 60 years we have been gathering to worship and scattering to serve as Second Baptist Church. The ways we express the love of God and bear the presence of Christ have not remained fixed in place for these last decades. Things – and people – change.

At the same time, the words of Saint Paul come to mind when he writes a letter to the Corinthians: "now faith, hope, and love abide, these three, and the greatest of these is love."

Any of us who have taken hold of faith, hope, and love that has been poured into us share a calling to pass those gifts along to others still. The mediums might be different, but the core of our life together finds expression in the sustaining gifts of the Spirit God sends and that still stirs in us.


