

A Persistent Temptation

We are living in an era of congregational decline. Faith communities of almost every denominational tradition are aging rapidly and seeing fewer and fewer actively engaged participants. The pandemic that started this decade served as an accelerator for a trend that was already in motion.

We are not immune to these realities in the little corner of the Kingdom we call home. If you and I have any kind of history with Second, we might sometimes be tempted to look around at the sanctuary or our Sunday school classrooms and see a lot of what – and who – is no longer there.

However, when we do that, we are prone to miss what – and who – is here. Sometimes, it takes a different perspective to help us recognize the goodness of what God continues to give us.

This summer, our partners with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship published a collection of stories from four churches across the country who are creatively engaging their communities and utilizing their facilities for greater good. I am happy to share with you that Second is one of those four featured congregations.

We are fortunate to be living in a time and place where we have opportunities to reimagine, discern, and dream what God is calling us to be and do. But, if we spend our time pining for bygone eras and expecting us to somehow magically get back to a way of being and doing church that is now past, we miss out on the opportunity to experience the life and work of the Church here and now.


Holiday Closing Reminder
