from the pastor

Like No Place Else

All of us are aware of the shifting dynamics of religious life and participation in our culture. The downward trends of attendance, engagement, and support for faith communities is well-documented. Most churches have seen somewhere between 30-50% of their prepandemic participants not return.

To say this is discouraging is an understatement. Anyone taking time to read this far into the church newsletter is likely to be someone who feels a close sense of connection to the Church generally and this church specifically. We feel the absences. We know that there is no such thing as a perfect community of faith and yet, there is also nothing quite like this place of grace in our lives. That is part of what keeps us coming back.

Philip Yancey, an author whose honesty and insight I cherish, has shared openly about his struggles with church and congregational engagement. He admits, "I rejected the church for a time because I found so little grace there. I returned because I found grace nowhere else."

Indeed, plenty of people do not associate the Church (capital "C") with words like grace, hospitality, welcoming, and loving.

Here in this little corner of the Kingdom we are privileged to call home, though, I hope and pray constantly that we will live up to the highest, best, and most Christ-like ideals; that we will be a place of grace and hospitality, welcome and love for all who come our way. In my (admittedly biased) opinion, this place is Second to none when it comes to being a place of grace.



Tony Evans tells a story of a time early in his ministry that he was driving a "klunker" car that needed mechanical work he didn't have money for. He



and his wife had a choice to tithe or to get the car fixed. They chose to honor God and trust Him to meet their needs. It was shortly after that the car caught fire! He was a little miffed at God because he had a \$200 deductible on his insurance. That is, until the mechanic showed him the deductible does not apply - in the case of fire!

It's sometimes hard to release what we have to God. It all comes down to faith.

Do we really believe God has our best interest at heart and that God can and will provide for our needs? Even when my husband and I were tempted to hold on to our tithe because we knew the expenses we had coming up, we gave to our church anyway. And we have never lacked anything that we need.
