from the pastor

Another Step in a New Direction

At the time of this issue's printing, our Second family has just practiced something that is at the heart of our life together as a Baptist faith community: a meeting!

Of course, worship and spiritual formation and mission are at the core of what we are about. However, the way our church organizes itself is in a manner that makes space for every person who is part of this congregation to have a voice in how we go about our work.

On the last Sunday in September, we took another step in the new direction that we collectively believe God is leading us. The vote to proceed with the next phases of our Front Porch project received strong affirmation: 93% in favor of moving our conversations out to the community, exploring the feasibility of our fundraising goals, determining the necessary zoning and construction considerations, and so much more. Our Front Porch Team has plenty of work ahead! And, as has been the case over the last year, the Team will keep the congregation informed and involved in its work at every step along the way.

Although we have a very significant majority of our congregation that voted to proceed with our next steps, I know that not everyone is of the same mind (again, this is part of our Baptist identity!). Understanding that not all people feel that Second should take another step in exploring these new ministry possibilities, I hope that throughout these coming months of exploration – and in the times leading to other meetings and other votes – *everyone* will continue to engage in the healthy processes of conversation. Whether you are adamantly opposed, thoroughly uncertain, or completely on board, the gift we can give one another in this season is to continue taking part.

I cannot think of many circumstances where it is better for us to talk *about* others rather than *with* them. I do not know of situations where it is the healthier option to criticize outcomes we do not like but not actively engage in the processes that lead up to those outcomes.

All of this to say, I am deeply grateful for the spirit of openness and willingness that so many in our church have demonstrated in this most recent season of discernment. We have decades of history working in our favor where we have, as the people of God at Second Baptist, walked alongside one another through times of change and exploration.

Know that I am grateful we are on this journey *together*. I am eager to see what we will discover still in the next steps we are taking.

Congregational Meetings Scheduled for October

This month has two congregational meetings on the calendar.

First, on Wednesday, October 18 at 6:00 p.m. we will gather in person (feel free to bring your own dinner) or on Zoom for our fourth quarterly meeting of the year. This is the time each year when we elect deacons to serve three-year terms beginning in January, vote on recommendations from the nominating committee for ministry area coordinators and committee leaders, and review a plan for funding our ministry and mission initiatives in the coming year.

Then, on Sunday, October 22 at 10:25 a.m. we will gather in the sanctuary for a specially called meeting with a single agenda item: to vote on the adoption of the 2024 ministry budget. This meeting does not include time for discussion, as that will take place on the Wednesday evening prior. **Please note**: instructions for voting electronically for those not able to be present for worship on Sunday will be sent prior to the meeting.

World Communion Sunday Celebration is October 1

Each year the first Sunday in October finds Christians around the globe gathering at the Lord's Table for the celebration of World Communion Sunday. As is our custom at Second Baptist Church, whenever we share this sacred meal, we also collect a special offering to support the benevolence ministries of our deacon body. Plan now to share – both at the table and in this collection – as we remember the depths of God's love for the world.


Intergenerational Movie Night in the Pumpkin Patch
