
Pumpkin Patch Appreciation Luncheon

Advent Devotionals Available

The season of Advent begins on December 3. We have free devotional guides available for everyone in the Second family to pick-up beginning Sunday, November 19.

In *Come, Emmanuel*, we have the opportunity to join Christians from around the world in the Advent tradition of reflecting on brief prayers known as the "O Antiphons." Christians have used the "O Antiphons" since the eighth century. Their name comes from the way each prayer begins: "O Wisdom," "O Lord," and so on.

Originally, the "O Antiphons" were sung during evening prayer, especially in the last seven days of Advent. Around the twelfth century, the "O Antiphons" became the basis for the familiar Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

The devotions begin the first Sunday of Advent and go through the celebration of

Epiphany on January 6. Please take one book per household and enjoy the rich traditions, reflections, and insights afforded for this sacred season of the year!

As you do your grocery shopping, please talk to your local grocery stores and ask for empty banana boxes. Whether you collect one box or a whole trunk full, they all help. Boxes can be dropped off at the church.
