### The Season of Lent at Second

During the 40 days leading to Easter, our weekly worship services will feature specific elements for prayer and reflection. While in Advent we light a candle each week in anticipation of Christ's birth, during the Lenten season we will extinguish a candle each week as we mark the gathering shadows that lead us to the cross. Additionally, we will hear from different members who share faith stories of their own "wilderness"




experiences, engage with art and scripture through different prayer practices, and share in singing songs that remind us of the significance of these days.

Everything that we do during these weeks is there to remind us that our celebration of the resurrection is made richer when we recall the depths of God's love and our desperate need for God's saving grace.

### Gathered Into One: Devotions for Lent

As in past years, during the Lenten season we are providing devotionals to everyone

who would like to receive one. *Gathered Into One* provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to Easter. The devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from First Corinthians. The writers then bring their diverse voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.

### Ash Wednesday Worship

Wednesday, February 14 at 6:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary The 40-day season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14. Our



congregation marks the start of this sacred time through a service of worship at 6:00 p.m. in the sanctuary that includes prayer, reflection, and the opportunity to receive ashes and other symbols that help us prepare the way for our Easter celebration on March 31. ## from the pastor

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

In case you haven't noticed from the front page of this issue of *Crossroads*, Lent is beginning this month. This year we have the rare convergence of Ash Wednesday (the start of the season) falling on Valentine's Day. This only happens about two or three times every century, so make plans to join us before your dinner reservation!

Going back to the 8th century, Christians around the world have marked the beginning of the Lenten season with worship on Ash Wednesday. As with many things in the wider Christian tradition, Baptists have been late adopters in taking up some of the ancient practices that help foster a more robust spirituality among us.

Ash Wednesday affords us the opportunity to remember. We remember the creation story in Genesis 2 where "the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life" (Genesis 2:7, NRSV). The dust of the ashes serves to remind us both of where and from whom we have come. The ashes stand as a stark reminder of our mortality.

Ash Wednesday invites us into faith practices older than we are and traditions that span across centuries. Going back to the story of Job and his turning away from a too-small-vision of God's way, he repents "in dust and ashes" (Job 42:6, NRSV). In various corners of the canon we find different biblical characters employing ashes to mark their bodies as signs of sorrow and repentance: Tamar in 2 Samuel 13:19; the wayward people of Israel in Jeremiah 6:26 and Ezekiel 27:30. Jesus invokes the practice in Matthew 11:31 when he issued warnings to those living in cities not heeding his invitation to repentance.

Many Christians' resistance to embrace the imposition of ashes is rooted in concern for the outward "showiness" of it (as if soot smeared above our eyebrows is particularly glamorous!). Echoing the sentiment that Jesus warned against in his Sermon on the Mount where he urged fasting to be done in secret (Matthew 6:16-18), some see imposing ashes as little more than spiritual showboating.

Of course, any of us can fall into that temptation, ashes or not. Part of the reason I so strongly value the outward sign is because it is such a stark, powerful reminder of how thoroughly human we are. Our only sure source of hope comes by way of God's gift of grace; grace that assures us there is life beyond this frail, broken life.

I hope you will engage with worship, not only on this special night, but through the duration of this 40-day season. These days promise to stretch us and afford us time to grow together in the faith we share.

### 2023 Year End Financial Report

During our congregational meeting in January, our Finance Committee updated the church on our generosity in the year just finished.

### **Together for Hope Arkansas**

Due to water system failures in the small community of Helena-West Helena, Arkansas,- complicated by last month's severe winter weather - these residents have been without water since late January. This means many residents do not have



access to adequate or safe water for drinking or cooking, bathing or flushing, or for washing clothes. A very difficult challenge for anyone but especially for a community that has experienced generations of persistent rural poverty. For over a decade, Second Baptist Church has partnered with an organization in

Helena called Together for Hope Arkansas. Daniel Johnson is on the board of that organization and leading the effort respond and help meet one of the primary emergency needs, bottled water.


