

Amanda Ripley is a storyteller. She is a *New York Times* bestselling author and an investigative journalist who writes about human behavior and change for the *Atlantic*, the *Washington Post* and other outlets. Her most recent book, *High Conflict*, chronicles how people get trapped in conflicts of all kinds—and how they get out. Her previous books include *The Unthinkable*, which was published in 15 countries and



turned into a PBS documentary, and *The Smartest Kids in the World*, a New York Times bestseller which was also turned into a documentary film. Her work has appeared in *The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, Slate, Politico, The Guardian* and *The Times of London*. Her stories helped *Time* win two National Magazine Awards. She is also the host of the *Slate* podcast How To! She has also appeared on ABC, NBC, CBS, CNN, FOX News and NPR. She has spoken at the Pentagon, the U.S. Senate, the State Department and the Department of Homeland Security, as well as dozens of conferences on leadership and communicating in conflict.

## one Church Giving online giving

I'm always looking for ways to save our church money. That's why they call me Penny Pinching Patti (or P-cubed for short!). We actually have a payment processor that saves us a lot of money now. OneChurch, our membership database, has the ability for you to give to Second, and we are only charged a flat 1% service charge, compared to 3 to 4% or more using other vendors.

If you're already giving electronically on a recurring schedule through Vanco Payment solutions, THANK YOU! But may I ask you to move those contributions to our OneChurch platform?

Every church member has access to OneChurch, to look up addresses and such when they are logged in. The web address is secondbaptist.onechurchsoftware.com (If you need help logging in please contact computer wizard Alisa Cunningham at 901-682-3395!) Once in the website, there's a green "Give Now" button at the top left. Enter the amount you want to give. The default account is Tithe 2024 (CBF). If you want to select a different account, select the arrow and scroll to the appropriate account. The default gift is "One time", but you can select "Recurring" and choose the frequency you wish to give. Put in your banking information, and then there's a box to select "add \$x.xx to cover processing fees". This box allows 100% of your gift to be given to Second Baptist! Then, click the "Give" button at the bottom. The donation will recur according to the schedule you select, and you can change the amount or frequency of the gift at any time.




