Teachers & Students of all ages - bring your backpacks to worship for our annual time of blessing before your school year begins. Please place them around the cross before church begins.





## Choosing Again and Again and Again

Do you remember the moment at the end of Joshua where he, as God's servant-leader, asks the people to choose whom they will serve? (Joshua 24:14-16)

At its best, the local church is a place where, each of us individually and we together collectively, make decisions over and over again that reflect who and what we are serving. The community of faith is constantly being called to consider how much we will give and how far we will go with the God who wants nothing less or other than to have our whole selves.

This month we have some special opportunities to consider our mission and ministry values together. ## Our City, Our Story

Looking for some impactful summer reading? Pick up a copy of Pulitzer-Prize winning author Andrea Elliott's book, *Invisible Child: Poverty, Survival, and Hope in an American City.* This will be the focus of our ministry partner MIFA's annual "Our City, Our Story" event in September.

Invisible Child follows eight dramatic years in the life of Dasani Coates, a child with an imagination as soaring as the skyscrapers near her Brooklyn homeless shelter. Born at the turn of a new

century, Dasani is named for the bottled water that comes to symbolize Brooklyn's gentrification and the shared aspirations of a divided city. As Dasani grows up, moving with her tight-knit family from shelter to shelter, this story goes back to trace the passage of Dasani's ancestors from slavery to the Great Migration north. By the time Dasani comes of age, New York City's homeless crisis is exploding as the chasm deepens between rich and poor.

## **OneChurch Online Giving**

Thanks so much to all of you who use our OneChurch Online Giving for your tithes and offerings! Gifts may be given once, or on a recurring basis.

Every church member has access to OneChurch to look up addresses and such when they are logged in. The web address is secondbaptist.onechurchsoftware.com (If you need help logging in please contact Alisa Cunningham at 901-682-3395!) Once in the website, there's a green "Give Now" button at the top left. Enter the amount you want to give. The default account is "Donation". If you want to select a different account, select the arrow and scroll to the appropriate account. The default gift is "One time", but you can select "Recurring" and choose the frequency you wish to give. Put in your banking information, and then there's a box to select "add \$x.xx to cover processing fees". This box allows 100% of your gift to be given to Second Baptist! Then, click the "Give" button at the bottom. The donation will recur according to the schedule you select, and you can change the amount or frequency of the gift at any time.



## PASSPORTKids Camp Theme: Wide Open Spaces

On Saturday, July 13, Amos, Carter, Davis, Joseph, Addie, Ava, Charli & Iva Kate and chaperones Aaron and Tanya left to participate in PassportKids Camp at



the Rock Eagle 4 H Center in Eatonton, GA. We first stopped for a fun afternoon of laser tag, skating, and bowling in Murfreesboro and drove to spend the night at FBC, Chattanooga. We arrived Sunday to begin our "WIDE OPEN SPACES" PassportKids Camp where we learned that we need spaces to feel welcomed, to act with Christ's love, to dance - to experience real joy. During the week, we participated in worship with interpretive dancing, singing and memorizing Bible verses that show God is always present in Wide Open Spaces. PassportKids was truly a blessing for all, and we are so appreciative of your prayers and cards you sent for each of us. We felt so loved and our campers are already making plans for another hilarious skit to present next year!

## South Africa Mission 2025

For years we have used the book <u>A Mile in My Shoes</u> by Trevor Hudson as the framework for our South Mission experiences. In the book, Hudson provides a paradigm for what he calls a "Pilgrimage of Pain and Hope" in which individuals encounter "the pain of our shattered and fragmented societies" while also encountering hope found in people who "resiliently refuse to become prisoners of helplessness and despair." On July 21, 28 people, 11 from Second Baptist Memphis, returned from just such a pilgrimage to South Africa, having encountered both the pain and the hope so prevalent in our South African neighbors. During the experience, our team encountered:

The pain in learning that a child was not taking their evening HIV medications because the family could only afford to provide one midday meal and the medicine needed to be taken with food, along with the hope of how our ministry partner could help support this family.

The pain of a gentleman suffering with multiple myeloma and the hope he found in receiving visitors and prayers from new friends from the other side of the world. The pain of a family assuming incorrectly a child's inability to use their arm was due to a stroke, and the hope of learning it was simply an injury from the birthing process and could be addressed with specific exercises.

The pain in knowing that many of the people we met would be losing their positions in a few months because of USAID cuts, and the hope found in the unshakable faith of our ministry partners who know that God will always provide.

The pain in learning that a group of girls had to walk for hours over a mountain just for the chance to play netball with a group of local church leaders and American volunteers, and the hope found when, after waiting hours, they finally had their chance to play.

The pain seen and felt in the leaders of the organizations with whom we serve as they tirelessly work to create safe places, empower communities, save lives, and care for so many who would otherwise be lost and forgotten. And the hope found when our presence and friendship lifts their spirits, validates their work, and celebrates how God is using their giftedness to help their neighbors know and feel God's loving touch.
