# To Know Christ, To Know Our Village

The seven words headlining this article are a succinct statement that summarizes what our Dawnings Leadership Team shared on the last Sunday in September. Everyone in our Second family will have opportunities to practice deeper, personal spiritual formation. Everyone will have occasions to create, cultivate, and keep relationships with the different groups and individuals who are part of our "village" here along Walnut Grove.

There is much, much more to be said and shared in the days ahead. For now, though, I simply ask you to consider if you are at a place where you feel like you are treading water in your life of faith and connection with others. If so, could it be that God is calling you to something more?

# The Weight of the Plate

During the offering time at our church, the offering plates are passed from the ushers to the people and from the people to one another. People put in cash, checks, envelopes, or notes. Most put in nothing at all.



After the plates have finished their rounds, they are stacked and brought forward and offered to God with a prayer of blessing. Then the plates are taken by the offering counters, who tally the gifts and prepare a bank deposit. What we learn later about the offering is that we always have enough to pay the costs of ministry. We are a giving church.

In most churches, weekly offering plate contributions have been replaced by monthly gifts, online giving, and bank drafts. Some congregations receive gifts through a phone app. What's in the plate on Sundays does not reflect all the gifts a church will receive. For many though, the weight of the plate seems less when compared to years past.

Except...what if the weight of the plate is significant regardless of what is in it? When the plate makes its way from person to person in our church, many people take the plate and hold it for a moment, and remember. Whether they put anything in the plate or not, people pause, feel the size and weight of the plate. And they are reminded and remember.

The plate, like the cross and the communion meal, can remind us of the God who called us into being. The plate suggests that there is an abundance available. The plate is strong enough to hold our sorrows and our fears. The plate holds hope that there is meaning and purpose for every life. The plate connects us to one another. The plate reminds us that God is enough.

Holding the plate for just a moment reminds us of what is important and real.

The plate is more than what is in it. The plate is like a symbol that, when held and pondered, becomes a spiritual portal to transformation.

Sunday, when the plates move down the pews in your church, regardless of what you see in them, feel the weight of the plate, be reminded, and remember, there's more in the plate than you see.


