Make plans to take part in this sacred time of blessing those who bless so many!

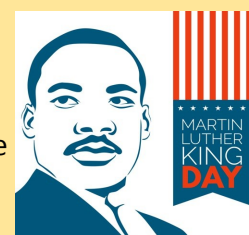

Forgiven and Forgiving

At the beginning of this new year, I am remembering a hope that the late South African archbishop, Desmond Tutu, said near the end of his life.

Christian faith animated his life in a way that was remarkably inspiring. His trademark laughter and the delight he found in the joys of this world – even amid its heartbreakingly hard and horrible things – are reminders of the goodness to be found alongside so much that is so out of sorts.

In his latter days, Bishop Tutu was asked: “How would you like to be remembered when you die?”

He declared: “I want to be remembered as one who was forgiven and was forgiving.”

Forgiven and forgiving. The order of those words seems especially important. One flows from the other. The latter is a product of the former.

Paul put a letter in the mail to the Ephesians. He included instructions that say:

*“Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another,
as God in Christ has forgiven you.” (4:32)*

You and I may never be memorialized on a big stage beyond our family and friends’ recollections as Bishop Tutu was at his passing. But what if we resolve at the start of this new year to live lives now that will – one day – be recalled for their kind, tenderhearted, forgiving ways because of Christ’s kind, tenderhearted, gift of forgiveness to us?

2BC Book Club Returns this Month!

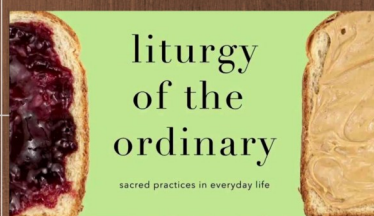

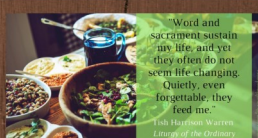

Sunday Morning Faith Formation

Are you participating in one of our Sunday school groups? Are you looking for a place of connection, community, and growing in your faith? Consider what our adult classes are sharing in the new year!

The Journey Class (room 220) – Jacqueline Martin, teacher

On January 11, The Journey Class will begin a five-week study in the letter of James. The letter of James may have been the first New Testament work that was written. However, it received so much criticism it was almost excluded from the New Testament. Be assured, the letter is saturated with Jesus' teachings, especially from the Sermon on the Mount. Join us on Sunday mornings at 9:00 as we explore the controversies, ask questions, and consider how our faith is meant to work, according to James. There will be five "chapter-a-week" sessions: January 11-Chapter 1; January 18-Chapter 2; January 25-Chapter 3; February 1-Chapter 4; February 8-Chapter 5. Young Adults (room 118) – Amy Cook, Jim and Catherine Lewis, teachers

We begin this new year with a unit that follows the lectionary. The next few months will cover prophecy and praise. In session 1, Jeremiah delivers God's own words to the people, promising that they may be mourning now, but joy is coming. Session 2 includes one of Isaiah's "servant songs," poetic proclamations of a dedicated servant who will bring about God's justice. In session 3, Isaiah declares that all God's people are the covenant and are called to be God's servants, bringing about justice. Finally, in session 4, Isaiah describes the cornerstone of this change: a child who is called by remarkable names: Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace (Isa 9:6). The prophets never paint a falsely rosy picture, but they also never give up hope.

The Forever Class (room 113) – Burt Waller, teacher

The Forever Class will begin January by spending two weeks, January 4 and 11, enjoying both familiar and newly popular hymns. This is always an engaging time for the group as we listen to various versions of a hymn in advance, read about the song writers' motivation and purpose, and spend time together sharing how the message and melody of the hymn have impacted us.

On January 4, we will also have a guest, Harley Wroten, the young man the group has prayed for and supported over the past six months. Harley will share his testimony and tell us about his next steps in his quest for a Naval Academy appointment.

Beginning on January 18 and continuing through March 1, we'll explore a 7-week study, The Wilderness, to guide our discussions. In the Bible, the wilderness is a place of both hardship and hope, where divine testing and provision shape humanity's faith. This study explores the Bible's wilderness theme by reading Scripture passages, considering insights, and discussing key takeaways. Each week includes the option for viewing a short on-line video from The Bible Project, designed to complement the focal scripture for the week.
