

## The Season of Lent at Second

During the 40 days leading to Easter, our weekly worship services will feature specific elements for prayer and reflection. While in Advent we light a candle each week in anticipation of Christ's birth, during the Lenten season we will extinguish a candle each week as we mark the gathering shadows that lead us to the cross. Additionally, we will hear from different members who share about "The Stories that Shape Us," engage with art and scripture through different prayer practices, and share in singing songs that remind us of the significance of these days.

Everything we do during these weeks is there to remind us that our celebration of the resurrection is made richer when we recall the depths of God's love and our desperate need for God's saving grace.

## ***Love Outpoured:*** **Devotions for Lent**

As in past years, during the Lenten season we are providing devotionals to everyone who would like to receive one. *Love Outpoured* focuses on portions of the apostle Paul's letter to the Romans. In words that continue to speak to us today, Paul lays out foundational beliefs for a life of faith in Christian community. The daily devotions for each day, from Ash Wednesday to Easter, begin with evocative images and brief scripture texts. The writers then bring their diverse voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.

## A message from the pastor

One of the earliest stories in scripture will be repeated in countless congregations around the world when the season of Lent begins.

In the creation account in the first chapters of Genesis, we learn the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil stands in the center of the garden. That tree is off limits. The first humans determine, though, that its fruit will make them more like God. But what they get when they eat from it is fear and shame, judgment and grief. So, God sends them packing, banished from the garden. And the word from God to the people in Genesis 3 is what we repeat every Ash Wednesday: "For dust you are and to dust you will return."

Ever since Adam and Eve it's been the same for us all. We know the old saw about the only two things we can be sure of in life are death and taxes. Emily Heath proposed an amendment to that. "The old line about death and taxes," she says, "really should say that there are two things you can be sure of in life: death, and the fact that while you live you are going to mess up. We are mortal, and we are fallible. These (even more than taxes) are the certainties of being a human being."

This is why the Church sets aside a special season given to getting our spiritual houses in order. Forty days given to remembering that we are broken, all of us. We confess our sins. Some of us even determine that we will do better. We give up this habit that separates us from God, take on another that draws us closer. And we kick it all off by having ashes smudged on our bodies. We speak the words spoken from near the beginning of time: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

It's certainly sobering if we dare face it. It's one thing to show up for Easter when it's all pastels and pretty, new outfits. It's quite another thing to show up for the journey that gets us there; a journey that includes going through a graveyard.

### **The Journey Class (room 220) – Jacqueline Martin, teacher**

The Journey Class is taking a walk through James. The letter of James may have been the first New Testament work that was written. However, it received so much criticism it was almost excluded from the New Testament. The letter is saturated with Jesus' teachings, though, especially from the Sermon on the Mount. This group is exploring the controversies, asking questions, and considering how our faith is meant to work, according to James.

### **Young Adults (room 118) – Amy Cook, Jim and Catherine Lewis, teachers**

#### **Object Lessons**

Jesus told stories that turned some of his listeners into followers and some of his followers into people who were willing to risk their lives for the sake of what he taught. At times, these stories are not easy for us to grasp; at other times, they can be easy enough to understand but difficult to embody in our daily lives. Often, our most transformative learning happens when we struggle to understand.

Many people recognize the presence of Christ, and their experience of him as the light allows them to move through dark times. What does Jesus, the light, still have to teach us?

### **The Forever Class (room 113) – Burt Waller, teacher**

Continuing through March 8, the Forever Class is studying, The Wilderness, a seven-week series developed by The Bible Project. In the Bible, the wilderness is a place of both hardship and hope, where divine testing and provision shape humanity's faith. This study explores the Bible's wilderness theme by reading Scripture passages, collecting insights, and discussing key takeaways. Each week includes the option for viewing a short on-line video from The Bible Project, designed to complement the focal scripture for the week


